Welcome to the Churchill Jr. High School Choir! As your director I promise to give my best effort to create a successful and positive learning environment. If you, the student, will agree to bring a good attitude as well as your best effort, we will not only create beautiful music, we'll have a lot of fun in the process!

This class provides students with an opportunity to sing in a choral setting during the school day. Students will learn about different styles of choral music through performance. Students will also learn aspects of music history, sight-singing, and music theory.

This booklet should answer any questions that students or their parents have regarding expectations for choir. After reading, if you still have questions or concerns, please contact me using the information provided above or via the Churchill website.

<u>Please take special note of concert dates</u> because performance attendance counts for a LARGE portion of the grade. Of most importance is your daily effort and contribution to the class!

At Churchill, Choir meets daily and is organized by grade level.

6th Grade Choir meets in room 99 during 8th period. 1:18-2:02

7th Grade Choir meets on the STAGE during 4th period. 10:25-11:09

8th Grade Choir meets in room 99 during 6th period. 12:01-12:45

CHORAL STUDENT EXPECTATIONS and GRADING POLICY

Participation - 40% of your overall grade

What is expected from you as a participant of the choral classroom? These are the things you are graded on when you earn points for participation every week in choir.

- · Sitting in your seat at the beginning of class with all materials.
- · Attempting to sing, move and follow all directions at the best of your ability.
- · Sitting with good posture and putting forth a solid effort.
- · Raising your hand to speak.
- · Assisting the teacher when needed.
- · Assisting fellow students when needed.
- Taking part in all classroom activities, singing or otherwise.
- · Completing or attempting to complete worksheets or homework.
- · Being attentive in all rehearsals.
- · Marking your music when appropriate.
- · Behaving in such a manner and maintain an attitude supportive to the learning environment.

<u>Concerts</u> - 40% of your overall grade

- · Attend ALL concerts on time dressed in the proper performance attire.
- · Stay for the entire concert.
- · Perform to the best of your ability.
- · Sit quietly while your peers are performing with no disruptive behavior.
- · Display proper concert etiquette.
- · Complete alternate assignments on time with quality.

Attendance at all rehearsals and performances is **MANDATORY**. Excused absences may be made up with a 300-word report. **Excused absences are considered to be unavoidable emergencies or personal illness**. Work, transportation problems, and other activities are not considered excused absences. Are there exceptions to what constitutes an **Excused Absence?** Possibly. Please be responsible and contact me *in advance* of any concert you need to miss so we can work out a solution that is fair to everyone.

NO CONCERT POLICY: A student MAY NOT participate in a concert if their Choir grade is below a B-. Singing in a concert is a PRIVELAGE that is EARNED over the course of the term. A grade falling below an "A" is typically the result of poor classroom behavior or non-participation. Instead, the student will be assigned to complete a written exam (approx. 1 hr) consisting of terms, concepts, theory, and history that has been covered during the term.

Assessments - 20% of your overall grade

Occasionally I will have worksheets and quizzes, and most of the time we complete all written assignments in class. These sheets will contribute to your knowledge of music symbology and theory, and will directly affect your musical literacy (reading and understanding).

CJHS CHOIR RULES, POLICIES, AND PROCEDURES

- 1. Come prepared: <u>mentally</u> and <u>physically</u>. Be on time and in your seat with required materials before the start of class. Do not be tardy!
- 2. Be respectful of all materials given to you (pencils, paper, books, music). Music is your textbook. YOU are responsible for the care and use of your music. Any missing or misused music will become your financial responsibility to replace at the cost of \$3 per missing or damaged music.
- 3. Materials not needed for class must be kept UNDER your chair or AWAY from the rehearsal area. We have limited space to work in. There is no need for a book bag, a purse, or other items that will not help you sing.
- 4. There is absolutely NO gum, food, or cell phones allowed in the choral classroom.
- 5. DO bring a water bottle to choir every day! Your voice must stay hydrated to work properly!
- 6. You will be given 2 bathroom passes for each quarter. Unused passes will NOT roll over to next quarter. If you choose not to use your passes, I will add an extra 3% per pass toward your quarterly grade.
- 7. Display a positive attitude! We all have bad days from time to time, but leave the luggage of the day outside the classroom if at all possible. Always speak positive things, never negative things.
- 8. Respect yourself and others. Be respectful of your teacher and fellow students by raising your hand to speak and not speaking over your teacher or fellow choir members. Never argue with your teacher. Problems can always be handled in a fair and calm way. Your teacher is always in control of the class. Only talk when you have permission to do so.
- 9. Show a positive contribution every day. Vocal music is a participation class. Each member is expected to uphold his/her responsibility of participation in all activities. If you have a day where you feel you cannot positively contribute, sit quietly and do not disturb the rest of the class. Disruption of the learning environment will have consequences. All I ask is that you do your best to participate. "Try" is the magic word!
- 10. Be a team player. Choir is about many voices joining into one voice to create beauty. Cooperating and working together will make us successful.
- 11. Maintain the appropriate posture and learn to take care of your voice. Maintaining good vocal health is of the utmost importance in Choir! If you are sick or have sore throat, in order to be excused from singing, you must bring a note from your parent/guardian/

doctor. If you are excused from singing, this does not excuse you from the class. You must still follow your music and pay attention at all times. You will be expected to learn by listening and following the music. Remember, you must be a productive member of the class, even in silence. If you do not bring a note, you will be expected to fully participate or receive a zero for the day.

- 12. Audition and experience as much as you can! Auditioning is a part of life-lessons. There are other opportunities for you at Churchill and more than one year to audition for things if you do not make it the first time around!
- 13. Remain on task and follow all instructions.
- 14. Improve the world.

DISCIPLINE PLAN

Since rehearsal time is valuable, none can be wasted. If I have to stop class on account of a student violating any of the above rules, they will be met with appropriate disciplinary action.

CHOIR PERFORMANCE ATTIRE

Choral attire for all performing groups (excluding Singing Streaks) will be as follows:

- Churchill Blue Polo Shirt (order form on last page of this handbook)
- Black pants or very nice black jeans. (no holes or dirty clothing)
- Black or dark dress shoes with black socks and belt. If you do not own black dress shoes, black tennis shoes are fine as long as they are clean and not falling apart. No flip flops!

Shirt orders will need to be placed by Friday, September 4th. Payment is asked to be turned in at time of order. Please return the last page of this handbook with payment. Shirts will be distributed the week prior to our first concert. If your child has a shirt that she's outgrown or has been damaged, please order a new one. Also, I appreciate your donation of shirts that have been out-grown. Please note that shirts ordered after September 4th will cost \$5 more per shirt. If you have access to a former choir member's shirt that is still in good condition, you are welcome to use it.

PLEASE do not let money be a reason for not being dressed properly for concerts. If a student or parent informs me in advance, we can assist with providing proper choir attire out of our choir closet for concerts. The choir closet contains a very limited number of choir polo shirts. We ask that they be washed and returned after use.

Students who need proper attire must notify the director in advance so that they can help that student. Waiting till the day of the concert to ask for proper attire is unacceptable.

Those students who do not wear the proper attire (and no proper attire is available) or refuse to do so may watch the concert from the audience, write a short review and receive partial credit for attire. They will receive full credit for attending. (Doing this is discouraged since students would be robbing themselves of the experience of performing which is why you take the course to begin with.)

Parents: If you have gently used black dress shoes, black dress slacks, black belts and black socks which your student has outgrown, please consider sending them for our choir closet.

OPPORTUNITIES

ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEST

This is a graded performance that is *required* for 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade choir. All students in these choirs are needed so we can be our best. This is an after-school field trip in February, where we go and sing with other competing middle school choirs. We will leave by bus from Churchill on a Friday afternoon and return later that evening. This event is free to the public and you are HIGHLY encouraged to attend and support us.

SOLO AND ENSEMBLE CONTEST

Students in 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade have an opportunity to participate in **Solo and Ensemble Contest** in March. Students are responsible for their own fees (\$3.00 per ensemble member, and \$7.00 per solo, *unless entry fees increase again this year*). This year the number of students I can take is limited, so those interested in participating are encouraged to let me know soon. It is the student's responsibility to practice sufficiently for participation.

SINGING STREAKS

Singing Streaks is an auditioned show choir made up of 6th, 7th and 8th grade choir students in District 205. The Singing Streaks perform throughout the community and have a wonderful reputation for fun and flare, combining voice, dance and theatrics. Auditions will be held in September. Once this year's members are selected, they will rehearse 3:00-5:00 on Friday afternoons **starting in October**. Members are required to keep a good academic and disciplinary standing to participate. Additionally, rehearsal attendance is required to retain membership in this group. More information will be sent home with those wanting to audition.
